SE3 Mission and Vision

➤ To attract and retain the best talent into our profession. And to ensure all structural engineers have a clear pathway to success in their careers.

We envision a world in which all practicing SEs do not perceive any barriers to remaining in the profession. Where structural engineers feel engaged and encouraged to contribute to society in new and innovative ways.



SE3 is not a women's initiative...

- ▶ A common misconception is that SE3 is a women's initiative. Though we fully support and encourage the advancement and retention of women in structural engineering, SE3 works to improve engagement, retention, diversity and inclusion <u>for everyone</u> in the profession.
- ▶ In SE3, we believe (and have witnessed firsthand) that working to improve the profession for an underrepresented group leads to tangible benefits for all.

What We Have Achieved Together!

- Increased collaboration across multiple SEA member organizations and other AEC organizations
- ▶ 15+ Presentations around the US and abroad
- ► Two symposia SEAONC (May) and NCSEA (November)
 - Over \$40,000 in corporate sponsorships between the two!!
- ▶ Publication of the 2018 Survey Report



Committee Outreach

- Positive feedback from NCSEA leaders and attendees


















2020 Committee Initiatives



2020 Survey

- Goals
 - ► Engage more respondents (5000) from previously under-represented areas
 - ► Cut down to 10 minutes
 - Directly tie questions to planned analysis
 - ▶ If we're not going to study it, we're not going to ask it!
 - ► Launched Open Call for Feedback/Questions
 - ► https://forms.gle/L53smbe8GSCQ94xq5
 - ► Launch in Spring 2020








Committee Outreach

- ► SEA Board Liaisons: establishing formal positions to increase communication with SEA MOs. Board liaisons will:
 - ► Set goals for local SE3 activity in 2020
 - ► Share committee updates with SEA MO Board
 - ► Help promote distribution of SE3 survey to members
 - Process survey data specifically for that member organization (response count permitting)
- Engage communities to identify which local issues to tackle





Programs



- Develop new content to share with SE community. Programs will go beyond the typical presentation on survey findings and will feature new topics and formats.
- ► Continue to schedule SE3 programs around the country to increase discussions on engagement, retention, diversity, and inclusion in the SE profession.



Publications

- ▶ Publish results of ongoing focused studies with past survey data
- ► Revise SE3 Committee Resource Guide
- Publish a revised Best Practice Guide
- ▶ Release shortened lists of questions for others to use in their own polls



Communications

- ► Consolidate multiple website presences and clarify SE3's mission. Distinguish between SE3 and women's initiatives.
- ▶ Re-organize various membership and advocacy lists to keep in more frequent contact with those who want to receive committee updates.


- Coinciding with NCSEA Summit Nov 3-6 in Las Vegas, NV
